Ambassador's Remarks at the "Divine India" Presentation, National Art Gallery, Astana (April 3, 2015)

Excellencies, distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen,

I am delighted to welcome you all to 'Divine India'- a presentation of Indian classical music and dance today evening as part of the Namaste India Festival being organized by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations and the Embassy.
